Can you think of a time when God turned tragedy into something good in your life?

Why do you think one person's boldness for Christ has the power to inspire others to live boldly for Jesus?

In vv15-18, how is Paul setting his own interests aside and demonstrating an attitude of "it's not about me?"

How is Paul's example a reflection of the cross of Christ? How does Paul point us to Jesus?

What unexpected obstacle are you currently facing that God wants you to see as an opportunity to live as a witness for Jesus?

What "open doors" for the gospel is God giving you?
